Where to plant?

Full sun
30 cm
Plant 80-100cm wide
Hanging baskets, urns or embankments

What do I plant it with?

Landscaping -
Try Zinnia Mambo Orange & Portulaca Raspberry (So Beautiful range)
Container -
Salvia Blue (Natural Beauty) placed at the rear of a square container with the Petunia 'Crazy' trailing down.

Interesting 'extra' info:

Petunias are a member of the potato family but their closest relatives are Nicotiana and Cestrum. The petunia originally came from South America and got its name from the native aboriginals who inhabited the land. The translation is said to loosely mean 'a kind of tobacco that doesn't make for a good smoke.'

The message the petunia brings to the person receiving the Petunia is that their presence and friendship soothes whoever it was that gave it to them.
